Secure End-To-End (SE2E) Messenger is an easy-to-use, open source, cross-platform end-to-end encrypted instant messaging solution. It is designed to securely communicate between 2 peers, the server and the client, using a secure Diffie–Hellman key exchange. Features: Secure Confidential, encrypted chat is provided Ability to use server and client-side, per-message key exchange and persession key exchange is also possible It uses the RMI and Java framework for instant messaging application. The source code is made open source, with the intention of it being used and redistributed by interested parties Implementation is written in Java Instantiates a server and a client (invoked by the server) Client securely login with the user account Implements a key exchange for client-side, permessage and per-session key exchange for the communication between the server and client Implements authentication for the client user with a password, for the server authentication with a certificate This project uses dynamic key exchange with Elliptic Curve Diffie-Hellman(ECDH) to achieve a secure connection between a server and a client. The algorithms are based on the standard FIPS 199. Since the protocol uses an ephemeral DH key exchange between the client and the server, the server does not have the public key of the client, making it possible to delete the public key after the connection has ended. This is more secure than static DH protocols. The protocol was conceived as a method for secure connections between a client and a server. The protocol is generic and can be used to secure traffic between different parties. This version uses only Elliptic Curve algorithms that are extremely fast and reliable. * It is a Java application based on the secure version of the RFC 3447/XEP-0383 as released by the IETF. * It supports all the XMPP features and uses several RFCs from the IETF and the SIP specifications. * It can connect through STUN/TURN and thus work behind the NAT. * It uses certificates to establish the ssl connection between both peers. * It has a session management mechanism to keep track of what peer is currently connected. * It can also use encrypted XML messages. * It has a nice user interface with a nice liquid look and feel, written in Java. * It has an option to keep track of session without being connected ("off-line"). * It does not depend on any server platform but works directly on a client platform. * It does not use the XMPP protocol for implementing the chat service (the user interface is done by a Java applet). * It has options that allow the user to adapt the message in background or to save messages in a file to be restored later. * It is based on the distributed services of the XMPP open source. * It does not have a default server where it expects to be configured (it runs "automatically" when the client is run). The Secure End-To-End Messenger project has been discontinued since 2009. It was supported since 2004 and was my first Java Secure End-To-End Messenger. License: License is the same as used in WhisperMail project, which is Apache License, Version 2.0. That means you can use it for any purpose. Modifications: The source code is available at SourceForge as part of my WhisperMail project. What's new: As I was not used to programming in Java, which I am now, I started my second attempt at it. I improved the source code and the project interface. Note: A chat or File Transfer session is started by means of a request from a Client. The Session Manager object keeps the connection alive and sends info to the Server. The Server accepts new requests and sends it to a Peer object, which in turns accepts new requests. Data is exchanged between the Server and the Client in both directions. If you want to include this project in a project or list it on a list, please feel free to do so. I'm just going to add it here since it was part of WhisperMail project from 2004 to 2009. I also placed a link to the code at the top of the introduction page. As a developer, I always look for ways to improve the code and extend it.
