Before AutoCAD, computer-assisted design was often done using manual drafting techniques and paper CAD, or mechanical CAD, which used special CAD software. The majority of CAD software, however, was designed for use by an individual with little training in drafting. In the late 1980s, the development of laser scanning technology changed the way CAD is used, and the types of CAD. Laser scanners quickly became affordable, and began replacing mechanical drafting techniques. Also, CAD became increasingly important for complex architectural design. AutoCAD introduced two main paradigms of design. These included geometric design and parametric design. Geometric Design involves designing a part by creating a series of line drawings. These curves define both the shapes and the layout of the design. The idea of parametric design comes from mechanical CAD, where the design is created by moving arcs on a screen, representing each piece of the design. Today, most design work is done using parametric design. Architectural CAD, mechanical CAD, and technical CAD are all examples of parametric design. But there are also parametric software tools used for furniture design, jewelry design, and even graphic design. In 2010, Autodesk released AutoCAD LT, a free, limited version of AutoCAD for beginners. AutoLISP and Visual LISP AutoLISP is a method of code execution using a software-based interpreter. AutoCAD provides the AutoLISP language along with the AutoCAD Exchange services for the custom application development and for programs that have AutoLISP code. AutoCAD has always supported Visual LISP, but as of AutoCAD 2013, AutoLISP is deprecated. Visual LISP is a method of code execution using a software-based interpreter. AutoCAD supports AutoLISP automation in both ObjectARX and Visual LISP. Before starting to work on the two-dimensional drawing, you should set the default units, the angle of the grid, the direction of the y-axis and the number of grid lines you require. You can also set the scale value you wish to use on the current drawing. Click on the menu bar in the left side of the workspace. Select Options then the Scale command. When the Scale dialog box appears, select a scale value from the drop down list. In this example the scale value has been set to 1:40 Select the Measure tool. Click on the window borders to enter the drawing window. Make sure that the settings shown in the following picture are set. In the current case, the scale is set to 1:40. Click on the right mouse button and select OK (see picture below). Select the Arrow tool. Click on the window borders to enter the drawing window. Make sure that the settings shown in the following picture are set. Then click the right mouse button and select the Arrow tool (in the menu bar of the left side). Select the Point option in the Measure dialog box. Enter the necessary values for the angle, length and height.
