Q: For a given number X , find the largest prime factor of number X . It seems so simple but I've been sitting on this for a long time and I just couldn't find a solution. A: The key to finding the largest prime factor of an integer is factorization theory. We already know that for a positive integer, the prime factorization is either $\prod_i p_i^{a_i}$ where the p_i 's are distinct primes, a_i 's are positive integers, or $\prod_i p_i^{n_i}$ where the p_i 's are distinct primes, n_i is a non-negative integer. So the prime factorization for $X = \prod_i p_i^{a_i}$ clearly means that $a_i \geq 0$ and $\sum a_i = X$ where we define $0^0=1$ so that $X = 1^0 \cdot \prod_i p_i = 1 \cdot \prod_i p_i$. Now, as for the factorization of $X = \prod_i p_i^{n_i}$ we also have that $n_i \geq 0$ and $\sum n_i = X$ where the sum of n_i 's includes the zero. So, the largest prime factor is just p_1 and we have that $X = p_1^n$. So, we can implement the algorithm by a simple loop: If the current value of n is 0 , we've got the largest prime factor. If the current value of n is not 0 , and $n \geq 1$, then let a_i be the current value of i (starting with 0) and decrease the value of n by 1 . If the current value of n is not 0 and n from django
