Evaluating the Impact of Health Promotion Strategies: NURS FPX 4025 Assessment 2

In NURS FPX 4025 Assessment 2, students are expected to assess a health promotion strategy related to a chosen population. This might involve analyzing efforts to reduce obesity, improve cardiovascular health, or increase vaccine adherence in a vulnerable group. Students must evaluate the effectiveness of community or organizational strategies using evidence-based research, public health data, and population health theories. NURS FPX 4025 Assessment 3 focuses on the nurse's role as an advocate for evidence-based change. In this assignment, students are tasked with creating a professional communication—such as a presentation or executive summary—that outlines a health promotion plan supported by current research. The objective is not only to present accurate information but to do so in a way that resonates with interprofessional teams and stakeholders. This assessment builds communication and leadership skills, positioning nurses as persuasive advocates for high-quality, research-driven care in clinical and community environments.

Applying the Quadruple Aim to Healthcare Challenges: NURS FPX 4035 Assessment 1

Capella's <u>NURS FPX 4035 Assessment 1</u> introduces students to the Quadruple Aim framework—enhancing patient experience, improving population health, reducing costs, and improving the work life of healthcare providers. Students are asked to select a healthcare challenge (e.g., hospital readmissions or chronic disease management) and evaluate how the challenge affects each of the four aims. This exercise encourages systemic thinking and helps nurses see the bigger picture when advocating for change or analyzing practice environments. It also lays a foundation for leadership roles that prioritize safety, sustainability, and satisfaction.

Evaluating Technology's Role in Healthcare Outcomes: NURS FPX 4035 Assessment 2

In NURS FPX 4035 Assessment 2, students explore the intersection of healthcare technology and clinical outcomes. The focus of this assignment is to assess how tools such as electronic health records (EHRs), remote monitoring, or decision-support systems impact care delivery and patient safety. Students are expected to weigh the benefits and limitations of these technologies and propose recommendations for improvement. By completing this assessment, learners strengthen their ability to analyze emerging innovations while prioritizing efficiency, privacy, and evidence-based decision-making in a digital healthcare environment.
